
UAA Book Club

The UAA Book Club is taking a vacation this summer. For your reading pleasure, Stu Callison recommends the recently published (November 2021) book, *The Diplomite*, authored by Diana Carr about her and her sister's life in post-World War II as the young daughters of a U.S. Foreign Service Officer, who was stationed in a succession of trouble spots after 1946. It is a compelling account of the author's life experiences growing up so far from home and is written from the unique perspective of the young daughters themselves. The book is available in paperback from both Amazon and Barnes & Noble for \$20.

Development Issues

On Wednesday, June 1, 2022, UAA's Development Issues Committee sponsored a well-attended virtual discussion on "COVID-19 and its Impact on USAID Health Programming and on Health Systems in Developing Countries," featuring Dr. Atul Gawande, USAID Assistant Administrator for Global Health and Javier Guzman, the Director of Health Policy and Senior Policy Fellow at the Center for Global Development (CGD) as discussion leaders.

In his opening remarks, Dr Gawande noted that COVID-19 was a "wake up call" on the inadequacy of health care systems in many countries, including the United States. The pandemic has been catalytic in introducing many innovations, including new ways of doing things for USAID.

Javier Guzman noted that the past two decades have witnessed a "golden era" of global health in increasing access to health care in lower income countries. At the same time, governments relied overly on foreign assistance, which can undermine domestic ownership and harm health systems development.
