As many of you may have already learned, Dr. Robert J. Muscat -- Bob--passed away in Virginia on January 10th, 2024 at age 92. Bob had been in poor physical health for the past several years, but his intellectual abilities were second to none and up to the last days of his life, he was busily focused on peacebuilding and conflict resolution issues, composing opinion pieces for newspaper submission and working on the text of a book-in-progress.

Bob, with enormous gusto and energy, sought to carve out nonviolent ways of addressing conflicts, in the US and internationally. He was a valued member of Global Peace Services USA and the GPS Board.

Travel directions to Takoma Village Cohousing in Washington, DC NW.

For driving from the south and west, we suggest north on 13th – to Piney Branch Rd. NW to turn right on Butternut Ave NW to a left on Fourth NW and park at or near Takoma Village Cohousing at 6827 Fourth St. NW in Washington, DC 20012.

The Metro Redline stop at Takoma MD is within a few relatively short blocks from the TVC in DC. From the Metro Station walk west on Carroll Ave. under the rail tracks to the intersection in DC with Blair Rd. NW and Fourth St. NW and turn left and walk on Fourth St. a bit more than two blocks to TVC on the left at 6827 Fourth St. NW.

On entering the TVC, walk to the end of the outside patio to enter the main hall.
