Reuters re State OIG to review aid projects, 11 Sep 2025

- State OIG says scaling up oversight projects
- New oversight will include programs on Ukraine, Gaza food aid, global health

WASHINGTON, Sept 11 (Reuters) - The U.S. State Department's independent watchdog said on Thursday it was expanding its oversight to include new <u>foreign assistance</u> <u>programs</u> the agency has taken over from the <u>U.S. Agency for International</u> <u>Development</u> after it was <u>dismantled</u> by the Trump administration.

The Office of Inspector General for the State Department will now conduct audits into how the agency is managing the many global health-related programs it has taken over from USAID, as well as look into the department's efforts to provide food aid in <u>Gaza</u> and how the military funding for <u>Ukraine</u> is managed.
